Requirements for all MPH-HAP and MHA Students

Students are required to participate in the campus-wide Interprofessional Education All Professions Days during their first year in the program. There is a two-hour session in the fall and another two-hour session in the spring. If a student is unable to attend the scheduled session(s), they can either attend the corresponding session the next academic year or substitute the session(s) with an Interprofessional Education event that is not already a component of a course, i.e., this experience must be extra-curricular.
